MBBS Seats in Jammu and Kashmir Increased to 1,750 Across 11 Medical Colleges



The Health Education Department of Jammu and Kashmir has announced an increase in MBBS seats to 1,750 for the upcoming academic year. This increment will be distributed equally across the 11 government medical colleges in the region, marking a significant step towards mitigating the shortage of doctors. Kashmir Life reported that this decision was made after a review of existing infrastructure and faculty capacity, which meets regulatory standards. Each college will receive a proportional share of the new seats based on its current capacity and facilities. Officials in the region believe that more graduates will serve in local public hospit...
