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Newspaper Vendor Shot Dead in Jammu



A newspaper vendor died after being shot in Jammu, officials said.

Jammu police confirmed that a newspaper vendor died after sustaining gunshot wounds. Kashmir Life reported that he was distributing newspapers when he was shot. The time and exact location of the incident have not yet been made public. Police have launched an investigation into the shooting, but no

suspect or motive has been identified so far. Witnesses have been urged to provide information to aid the investigation. This death is raising concerns about safety among local vendors and citizens, leading to demands for increased police presence in commercial areas.

J&K Police Apprehend Nine Drug Peddlers Across Five Areas

The Jammu and Kashmir Police have apprehended nine individuals involved in drug trafficking during coordinated raids across five distinct locations in the Union Territory. The operation, conducted by the Crime Branch, targeted suspects operating in small networks. Police stated that no violence or public disturbance occurred during the arrests. Recovered substances included various types of narcotics, though their exact quantity or type has not been publicly disclosed. Investigations will continue to uncover the full extent of the trafficking network and apprehend additional accomplices.

Two Jaish Terrorists Killed, One Suspect Detained in Udhampur, Jammu

Security forces have killed two terrorists belonging to the Jaish group in the Udhampur district of Jammu, officials reported. Along with the two deceased, another suspect, believed to be associated with the same group, was taken into custody. Information is currently being gathered from this arrested individual regarding the group's operations and plans.
